

Welcome to Lochaber



The entire event team, together with Nevis Range, the Forestry Commission and the people of Lochaber, have worked hard to ensure an exciting, enjoyable weekend of mountain bike action.

Travel Most of you will be coming from the south - remember there are no motorways north of Perth and Glasgow - but some glorious scenery instead.

Basic road directions are on the website (www.fortwilliamworldcup.co.uk) and AA signs will be in place from the A86 at Spean Bridge and the A82 at Fort William. A comprehensive list of public transport options are listed on the website.

Cycleway The cycleway from Fort William to Torlundy, and then to the World Cup Village, is an easy, fun way to get to the heart of the action. The Alpinebikes Park will be operational on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, with the chance of a service while you watch the action. Remember your bike lock.

Parking There will be no spectator parking in the Nevis Range car park which will be taken over by the World Cup Village.

Fri, Sat & Sun. There will be a charge to park at the Rural Complex, about 1km from the World Cup Village, on the Nevis Range access road. A footpath takes you straight to the World Cup Village and there will be a limited shuttle bus service for the very old, very young or infirm from the Rural Complex.

When parking at the Rural Complex is full, you will be directed to alternative free Park & Ride car parks just outside Fort William. Shuttle buses will operate from all of these locations to the World Cup Village. There is also public parking in Fort William itself – at An Aird and the West End car parks. This parking is subject to normal rates. Please take note of signs advising when car parks are full and follow the directions of Police, Traffic Wardens and our own Parking Stewards.

Free Shuttle Buses Free shuttle buses will operate on 3 routes. Please note there is a less frequent service on Friday morning. The frequent service runs on Friday evening, Saturday and Sunday. For outline times and frequency go to www.fortwilliamworldcup.co.uk.

Route 1 (Red route) - Town Centre Starts at the town centre (pick ups - outside the Police station on High Street and Middle St, behind the post office), then service stops between Ellis Brigham and the Lochaber Leisure Complex and opposite Nevis Bank hotel near Glen Nevis roundabout and then the Park & Ride at Corries yard.

Route 2 (Green route) - Corpach Runs from Corpach, then Banavie and the High School with a number of marked stops.

Route 3 (Yellow route) - Spean Bridge Fri - evening, Sat and Sunday only. Pick ups at school and service stop outside the Little Chef.

All shuttle buses will be clearly marked and will run continuously until all spectators have left the World Cup Village after racing.
